# **Principal's Report**

This newsletter marks the farewell of our Class of 2016. Students begin their VCE exams on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> October and I know that you join with me in wishing them all the best for their exams and for the future.

The College community celebrated their departure with a whole school assembly in the stadium yesterday morning followed by a morning tea hosted by their Year 7 buddies.

I would like to thank College Captains Madeline Stier and Tom Abbey and the outgoing college student leadership team for their outstanding involvement and commitment to Macleod College during their tenure this year. They have performed their roles admirably and have been solid advocates for the entire student population.

Student leaders are the heart and soul of the College, supporting staff and students and leading many College events.

#### **Car Park**

The changes to existing car park arrangements have been put on hold following advice from the department regarding public liability. In particular, if parents are permitted to drive through the car park and use it as a drop off zone then the College will be liable for all injuries incurred.

The recommendation was to continue to lock the gate at pick up/drop off time and to work with our local government to develop a road safety strategy.

I have spoken to members of the Banyule council and in the short term, have asked by laws officers to enforce parking restrictions around the school. After the election this coming weekend I will meet with the councillors to discuss a long term solution to traffic congestion and pedestrian safety.


#### 2017 Planning

#### **Second Hand Uniform**

This is the last term in which the old style uniform can be worn by students in Years 2-6 and Years 9-12 (though Year 11 and 12 students must have a new VCE jumper). The Second-hand uniform shop has all of the old uniform at **50% off the marked price** (which is usually at least half of what the new price would have been). This includes the old Spray jackets — the new ones are slightly different, but both are acceptable as a PE jacket. So please come and help us reduce our stock!

We are still accepting old-style uniform in good condition as we are sending this, via Rotary, to the Pacific region for families in need. We are really keen to have some new style second-hand uniform to sell! Remember that we sell on consignment: the owner of the uniform gets 70% of our selling price (which is determined by the quality of the item, usually half the new price), and the school keeps 30%.

We process our sales several times a year and the amounts owed are deposited directly into your bank account. Please fill out a form with all your details and the items you are selling. These are available at the office and there is one printed in this newsletter. And we are always happy to accept donations as well – just drop them off at the school office.

An order form has also been included if you are unable to come to the Second-hand uniform shop when it is open on Thursdays between 3 and 3.30pm.

 YEAR 12 VICTORIAN TERTIARY ADMISSIONS CENTRE (VTAC) timely applications closed on 29 September; applications can still be made, but now cost \$100.



Best wishes to those of you who move into other forms of education in 2017, be it university, VET, an apprenticeship or traineeship, or into employment.

#### **YEAR 12 AND VTAC**

Late **course applications** can still be made, but now cost \$100 (till 4 Nov). After that, applications will cost \$130 (till 2 Dec). The payment **deadline** for most applicants is **19 December**.

Course **preference changes** can be made till 12 noon 20 December, except for the period 8 – 21 November; they can also be made **between Offer Rounds** in January and February

The **first Offer Round** of courses will be on 18 January, the second on 7 February. There will be three later rounds of offers as well

You are advised to accept your first offer of a tertiary place. Most applicants will only receive one offer. Accepting an offer does not

**stop you from receiving a later offer** for a course higher in your preference list.

WHERE CAN I GET ASSISTANCE DURING 'CHANGE OF PREFERENCE' WEEK? The week after you receive your ATAR is generally known as Change of Preference (COP) week (Mon 12 – noon to Tues 20 December). During this time tertiary institutions run information sessions, COP Expos, offer phone assistance, and will help you in any way they can. You can also obtain assistance at school.

- Complete a course at Monash College in Art & Design, Arts (Human Behaviour or Psychology streams), Business or Commerce, Engineering or Science; search Courses on VTAC website
- Complete a course at **Deakin College** in Commerce, Computing, Engineering, Health Sciences, Management, Media and Communication or Science
- Complete a UniLink Diploma at Swinburne (Arts and Communications, Business, Design, Engineering, Health Science, IT, Science)
- Complete a Diploma at La Trobe Melbourne in Biosciences, Business, Engineering, Health Sciences, IT or Mass Media Communications
- Complete a Tertiary Preparation Course at RMIT in engineering or science




