Passport and Visa Requirements:

Students with an Australian passport do not need a visa, unless they will be staying for an extended period which exceeds 3 months.

The passport must have a minimum of 6 months remaining from the date of departure from Germany.

Students with passports from other countries must check with the German embassy in order to ensure they do not require a visa. This should be done at the earliest opportunity to ensure that they have time to apply for any visa required.

Payment

A deposit of \$ 500 has to be made at the office before 11th October. The overall costs of \$ 5 849 can be paid monthly from January to July in \$ 765 installments.
