# **NAPLAN ONLINE 2019**

Macleod College will be conducting NAPLAN Online in 2019 during the prescribed test window of 14 May - 24 May 2019. Year 3 Writing will continue to be delivered by pen and paper.

# **Headphones**

Students will require headphones, earphones or earbuds for the Conventions of Language test, in order to hear the spelling items delivered via audio. Students will also require headphones if they choose to use the audio player in the Numeracy and Writing tests. While their use is optional in these tests, it is highly recommended. Students are not permitted to use headphones for the Reading test.

For Health reasons Macleod College is unable to provide headphones for students. Please ensure your child in Years 3, 5, 7 & 9 have the necessary equipment to undertake NAPLAN Online.

#### **Student Familiarisation**

It is a requirement that students have the opportunity to become familiar with the question types contained in the NAPLAN Online tests. From Monday 25 March to Friday 26 April, Macleod College will conduct practice tests for students to experience the NAPLAN Online environment and familiarise themselves with the different types of questions.

#### **Public Demonstration Site**

In advance of taking NAPLAN Online, students, teachers and parents are invited to use the public demonstration tests to familiarise themselves with the type of questions and related functionalities available in the NAPLAN Online assessment.

Some of the key features include a range of question types, on screen tools, timers and interactive navigation. Students are encouraged to try all the tests for their year level to practise the complete range of question formats available in the online assessment.

The demonstration tests cover a sample of possible questions and do not reflect the range of literacy and numeracy content or skills NAPLAN Online will assess. While it is helpful for students to become familiar and comfortable with the format of the online test, ACARA does not encourage students to study separately for NAPLAN. The Meditation Garden is planted almost entirely with natives so the need to water these hardy plants, is an indication of how hot and dry it has been, and the need for careful plant selection as climate change descends upon us

#### Tip of the Week: Are your figs ripe?



The only way to lest for ripeness is the squeeze test. Squeeze gently all around for softness. Any firmness means that the fig is unripe. Note that a fig that has ripened an the side facing the sun maybe quite unripe on its opposite side and needs to be left on the tree longer. This is important because once picked, figs no longer ripen.


