### **Transition**



# Accessing centre-based care

Family 1 is charged \$100 per session for a 10 hour day – that is, \$10 per hour. As this is less than the maximum hourly rate cap of \$11.55; their percentage of subsidy will be based on what they pay – \$10. If their combined family income is \$65,000 they will be entitled to a subsidy of \$8.50 per hour (85% of \$10).

Family 2 is charged \$130 per session for a 10 hour day – that is, \$13 per hour. Because this is more than the maximum, their level of subsidy will be based on the cap of \$11.55°. If their combined family income is \$65,000 they will be entitled to a subsidy of \$9.82 per hour (85% of \$11.55).

# Child Care Safety Net

The package includes a \$1.2 billion Safety Net to give the most vulnerable and disadvantaged children, including those from regional and remote communities, a strong start through access to quality early learning and child care.

# Additional Child Care Subsidy

Included in the Child Care Safety Net is an Additional Child Care Subsidy. It will, in most cases, cover all of a child's fees. It is designed to support:

- families who require practical help to support their children's safety and wellbeing
- · grandparents who are primary carers
- · families experiencing temporary financial hardship
- · families transitioning from income support to work.

The Additional Child Care Subsidy replaces a number of existing payments including the Special Child Care Benefit and the Jobs, Education and Training Child Care Fee Assistance.

# What do I need to do?

The current arrangements do not change until 2 July 2018. More information about what you need to do will be available in early 2018.

# What's changing?

From 2 July 2018, there will be a new child care package. The package includes a new Child Care Subsidy, which replaces the current Child Care Benefit and Child Care Rebate. It will be paid directly to child care services, and will make child care more affordable for most families.

# Annual subsidy cap

Families earning less than \$185,710 will have no cap on the amount of child care they can claim. Families earning over \$185,710 and under \$350,000 will benefit from an increase in the current cap of \$7,613 to \$10,000 per child, per year


\*These provisions of the package will be increased by CPI for implementation in July 2018.

# How does it work?

Three things will determine a family's level of Child Care Subsidy:

# 1. Combined family income

A family's income will determine the percentage of subsidy they are eligible for.





# 2. Activity level of parents

The number of hours of subsidised care families can access, will be determined by an activity test. The higher the level of activity, the more hours of subsidised care families can access, up to a maximum of 100 hours per fortnight.

### RECOGNISED ACTIVITIES

- paid work including leave, such as maternity leave
- looking for work
   volunteering
- · study and training
- · self-employment
- unpaid work in family
- other activities on a case-by-case basis,

There will be exemptions for parents who legitimately cannot meet the activity test requirements.

### HOURS OF ACTIVITY

The parent with the lowest hours of activity per fortnight will determine the hours of subsidised care. The hours of subsidy are per child.



\*per fortnight

For families who do not meet the activity test, there will be an exemption to ensure their preschool aged child can attend a preschool program in a centre-based care service. The exemption will be for the period of the preschool program.

# 3. Type of child care service

It will be calculated by the hour using these hourly rate caps:

- · Centre-based care \$11.55° per hour
- . Family day care \$10.70° per hour
- Outside school hours care \$10.10° per hour.
