ICAS Testing for 2018

Our school is taking part in ICAS in 2018. This assessment can help benchmark and track learning progress.

First Aid Sessions with St John's Ambulance

The students participated in a free First Aid session with a St John's Ambulance trainer on Monday 5th March. Each class attended with their teacher and learned some basic first aid such as how to treat a bleeding nose, what to do if you are bitten by a snake, how to treat a burn as well as how they can help others in emergency situations, using 000 correctly and much more.

This was a really valuable experience for the children and I hope one that will equip them well if they encounter any of these situations in the future.

Curriculum Day – Wednesday 21st March

Next Wednesday is a curriculum day and students will not come to school. The teachers will be attending a professional development day with Pam Hook.

Pam Hook has developed a unique classroom based approach to **SOLO Taxonomy** (Biggs and Collis 1982). When using SOLO Taxonomy in classrooms the focus is on the complexity of the structure of the student response, rather than on a categorisation of the student themselves. Students use SOLO as a model to self-assess the depth of their learning outcomes for different tasks.

School Athletics Day

This will be happening on Monday 26th March and due to the success of the way the day ran last year we will be running with the same arrangement again this year. The Year 5/6 students will attend the event with the Year 7-12 students at Meadow Glen Athletics Track and the P-Year 4s will remain here at school.

We will be running events on the ovals near the stadium over the morning, followed by a barbecue lunch. Depending on the weather we will either continue with more events in the afternoon or provide another alternative for the children to enjoy.

Yoga for P-2

The P-2 children have been participating in yoga sessions at the Macleod YMCA on Friday afternoons this term. This program complements their focus on positive education. They are learning postures and breathing techniques which help them to regulate their emotions as well as meditation techniques to help them to calm and relax.

The teachers have noticed subtle positive influences this is having on classroom behaviour which will certainly benefit learning.

Gymnastics for Year 3/4

Next term the Year 3/4s will participate in their gymnastics program at the Macleod YMCA. This year we have elected to take only gymnastics classes instead of the option of Commando Kids being in the mix. We are responding to the feedback given to us by the children last year who attended this program.

We are very fortunate to have this facility right on our doorstep, as we are able to offer these extra curricula offerings without having to consider the extra cost of transport to and from the venue. Please check Compass for this event where you can give consent and make payment.

A great example of Parent Involvement

The Year 5/6s were pleased to host an expert in the area of microbiology this week. Dinh, Long's Dad, who is a microbiologist came to share his knowledge with the children as part of our Marvellous Micro organisms unit this term. The children are learning about micro organisms like yeast and mould.

They prepared questions for Dinh and learnt what it is like to work in this fascinating field of science. This type of experience really enhances the children's learning and can open their eyes to the possibilities of careers in the future. When I go to open house my favourite thing to do is the challenges and playing UNO. Hope you come along and join in on all the fun.


